For those who dream of spending the night in a fairytale Castle fit for Royalty, Warwick Castle has unveiled two magnificent Tower Suites appointed with bespoke furniture and fittings in the 14th century Caesar's Tower, rooms familiar to generations of kings, queen and noblemen. Evoking the opulence of the Victorian era, the apartments – The Peacock Suite and The Rose Suite – offer guests the first opportunity in living memory to spend the night resplendent in their own private chamber at the Castle which enjoys a wealth of Royal connections.

The Tower Suites cost £600 per night for two adults to indulge in an overnight stay with breakfast, and enjoy a private Castle tour and two days priority access to the Castle attractions.

Each Suite is located on its own private floor of the 14th century Caesar's Tower and comprises of an opulent bed chamber replete with four-poster bed in addition to contemporary en-suite facilities. All aspects of the accommodation, including the furniture and fabrics, have been designed and created specifically for this exceptional location and to compliment the mediaeval architecture which includes vaulted ceilings.

Geoff Spooner, General Manager at Warwick Castle, said: "Awakening in a hand-carved four-poster bed in a private Tower Suite is no longer a fairytale: we're making our guests' dreams come true whilst remaining faithful to the heritage of the Castle by ensuring the Suites are furnished with bespoke crafted items that resonate with their fully-restored surroundings. Spending the night in a Tower Suite will be a magical experience, memorable for years to come."

Warwick Castle has provided generations of aristocracy and Royalty – including Anne Neville, the wife of Richard III, and the Earls of Warwick – with a comfortable home, while other notable guests over the centuries include Henry V, Elizabeth I and Queen Victoria. The rooms that have been restored to become the Tower Suites housed Edward IV during his enforced stay at the Castle in 1469, part of a plot by Richard Neville, Earl of Warwick to rule England. Most recently HRH The Prince of Wales visited the Castle in June 2014 to mark its 1,100th anniversary and enjoy Afternoon Tea in The State Dining Room.

The Castle, commanding an enviable position on the banks of the River Avon, is located at the heart of historic Warwick, a county town renowned for its mediaeval architecture and proximity to the birthplace of William Shakespeare at Stratford-upon-Avon.

One night in a Warwick Castle Tower Suite costs £600, based on two adults sharing, including breakfast, a personal round-the-clock concierge service, a private expert-led Castle tour, two days priority access to all Castle attractions and car parking. 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Notes to Editors:

Warwick Castle is easily accessible from Junction 15 of the M40, just 40 minutes from Birmingham and 1 hour 40 minutes from London. Warwick Castle is easy to reach by train from London Marylebone in only 86 minutes.

The Castle, set in 60 acres of grounds designed by Capability Brown, rests on the banks of the River Avon at the heart of historic Warwick. Throughout 2014, every show and attraction at Warwick Castle will be re-imagined as part of celebrations to mark the site's 1,100th anniversary.

The Trebuchet Fireball Spectacular,) features the world's largest working siege engine hurling fireballs further than ever before and towers of flames thirty feet high. The new show, on the banks of the River Avon, is the fiery start to the year-long celebrations and takes place twice daily.

Afternoon Tea: taken in The State Dining Room from £59pp including Taittinger champagne and a selection of fine teas and patisseries, this is where seven monarchs have been entertained.

New for Easter 2014 was the addition the UK's only free flying Andean Condor and the only one to take part in a show of this kind. With a wingspan of up to 10ft 6in, these birds are the largest bird of prey in the world.

Glamping makes a welcome return to the Castle's riverside meadow this summer (until 6 September), now with 41 tents including three new luxury King's Tents and 38 Warwick Tents. Costing from £200 per night for a family of up to six, the price includes breakfast, two-day Castle admission, car parking and entertainment. King's Tents even feature wooden four-poster beds.
