Main Castle entrance





Some people prefer to visit this exhibition between 2 and 3 pm, when we have a quiet time, with less people and much quieter sound

The Gaol



Next to the Kingmaker, you will find the Gaol, to get inside you need to descend a set of narrow steep steps, the Gaol is quite dark and cramped but really interesting. Please note that because the Gaol is very small it can sometimes feel very crowded. One of your party may wish to check before you enter.



The time tower





Also in the castle courtyard is the time tower. You may have to wait 5 minutes to get in as it has an automatic entrance. There are two rooms, where you will see animations showing the castle's history.



The birds of prey show





At 12 o'clock you can go to see our birds of prey show, this is down by the river and takes place even if it rains. If you miss the 12 o'clock show, don't worry because we put it on again at 2.30pm.



The mill and engine house





From birds of prey you could take a left turn along the river to the Mill and engine house. There is a big water wheel and lots of interesting machines. There are quiet sound effects. The mill is often missed by guests and is usually very quiet.
